STOLEN WELLCAP CERTIFICATES

A shipment of 50 WellCAP certificates was among the items stolen when a delivery truck was hijacked in Brazil on 16 October 2001. The certificates were in transit to a WellCAP school in Campos, RJ when the theft occurred. Although police are investigating the incident, the shipment has not been recovered and is considered to be lost.

IADC promptly sent a replacement shipment to the school, and the stolen certificates have been marked as invalid in the IADC accreditation database. The certificates were in **English** and numbered **A209903** through **A209952**.

IADC requests all schools to pass this information to their customers and other industry contacts. IADC urges contractors and operators to be vigilant in observing certificate numbers should an attempt be made to use any of the stolen certificates.
